Course Overview

This course will encourage you to develop a sociological imagination, i.e., a capacity to understand how seemingly personal matters are shaped by larger social forces. The sociological imagination involves making linkages between private issues and social problems. It will do so by examining major topics of sociological inquiry, such as social interaction, groups and organizations, deviant behavior and social control, social class and inequality, racial and ethnic relations, gender stratifications, religion, and sport.

Class meeting include lectures, movies, and discussions in small groups. Students are expected to take an active part in the classroom.

Grading Policy

Your grade will be based on the following elements:

1) Small Group Sessions

Small group sessions will be held several two times every week to offer you the opportunity to discuss and evaluate your reading materials. A few questions will be handed out at the beginning of each session to bring a focus to these discussions and provide a means through which to develop your responses. Your responses will be graded (20%).

2) Quizzes

Three multiple-choice quizzes will be given throughout the semester (10% x3 quizzes = %30)
